RECRUITING RESIDENTS FOR PUBLIC HOUSING

Application Period from Dec 2nd to Dec 12th

The city recruits residents for standard public housing. Some parts of the housing can be

applied for by single people under the age of 59 who meet the criteria. For more details on application qualifications please confirm by the application guide* that will be distributed from Dec. 2nd. The next recruitment is scheduled around early April next year.

• The places of the distribution are the followings; Nishinomiya Municipal Housing Management Center(City Hall South Wing 3rd Floor), Housing Occupancy and Rent Division (City Hall Ikeda Building 4th Floor), City Hall Main building 1st Floor next to the General Information Desk, Each Branch office Citizen Service Center(except Koshikiiwa), ACTA Nishinomiya Station and Wakatake Life and Culture Hall.

Standard Municipal Housing 45 units in total are planned with some priority for the elderly and handicapped people, etc.

AFTER-SCHOOL CHILDCARE CENTERS FOR WORKING FAMILIES

Application for next year's enrollment to after-school childcare centers will be accepted from Dec. 2-27. The After-school Childcare Centers for Working Families (hereinafter "childcare center") will provide an appropriate place to play and live for children who do not have a guardian at home during the daytime due to work or other reasons, as well as a place for their sound upbringing after school and during long recess such as summer vacation. These facilities are operated by appointed administrators.

Notice regarding National Health Insurance and Medical Care System for the Elderly

INSURANCE CARD (Dec. 2nd and after)

From December 2nd, the current insurance card will no longer be

issued, and the system will be shifted to one based on the My Number insurance card (a My Number card registered for use as a health insurance card). However, any insurance card issued before December 1st will be valid until such card's expiration date. For those who do not have a My Number insurance card, a "qualification confirmation card" will be mailed before the expiration date of their insurance card (no application is required). By presenting the "qualification confirmation card", you will be able to receive insured health care services at medical institutions, etc. For details, please confirm with the City's website.

In addition, with respect to the Medical Care System for the Elderly, as a temporary measure until July of next year, a "qualification confirmation card" will be mailed to those who have a My Number card, if such person is newly enrolled or there are changes to the information on the insurance card.

If you wish to use your My Number card as a health insurance card, you must register in advance. If after registering, you wish to cancel your registration, you must apply for the cancellation. For details, please confirm with the City's website.

HEALTH COLUMN (November) ~Advice from a public health nurse~ ♦ Ventilate frequently for infection disease measure.

Infectious disease is prevalent in all seasons. It is the most important infection measure to prevent the

infection. Many people must wear the mask outside, or wash hands or gargle after returning home to avoid bringing in viruses or bacteria. In addition to that, frequent ventilation is very important.

Because of getting colder, we will turn on the heater more often. Without ventilating, viruses and bacteria stay in the room with the warm air. Therefore, it is necessary to let the indoor air out regularly. Once an hour, for around five to ten minutes, open two places, such as doors or windows, to ventilate effectively.

The Junior High School Union Athletic Meet started in 1951 when three villages of Naruo, Shiose and Yamaguchi were merged into Nishinomiya. In 1951, 5 years have passed since the new-system junior high school was established.

The first Athletic Meet was held at the Nishinomiya Stadium in Nishinomiya-kitaguchi. The second Athletic Meet was held at the Hanshin Koshien Stadium by courtesy of Mr. Seizo Noda, the Athletic Association Chairman (the President of Hanshin Electric Railway Co., Ltd.) at that time. Since then, the Athletic Meet has been held there every year and the Citizens are proud of it. In the Athletic Meet, participants enjoy free gymnastics and dance in a group, interschool relays, etc. together with the audience.

The Elementary School Union Athletic Meet for the 6thgrade students is also held at the Hanshin Koshien Stadium.
